community.



Leading up to the event, Coolamon's Badji staff were actively involved in the management of the project, investing much time and numerous meetings with Blaklabel and service providers, including:

- The Ngunnawal Centre UC, to source models CIT students and teachers, for models' hair and makeup
- Transport Community City Services, for transport of models between CIT and the Canberra Centre
- Eventbrite, setting up the event on the app
- Canberra Centre, for hosting the event in one of their busiest foot traffic spaces, supplying a stage, runway, event furniture, back of house areas, AV and catering
- OATSIA, to obtain grant funding
- Culture on the Move, a Badji participant who created the jewellery worn by the models

We were pleased to work with Kristie, to share the excitement of the Indigenous community and see the overwhelming success of the show.

The PACE truck will provide portable and reliable IT services to regional and remote communities.

It will allow remote community members to access the internet, such as high school students studying for exams, and medical practioners to offer telehealth appointments.

Other access opportunities include:

- Health and wellbeing information
- Educational and research institutions
- Government departments including Services Australia and Medicare
- Legal representation
- Employment services and training providers
