


Traditional Owners Aboriginal Corporation (TOAC) at Floriade



Annual Pitch

Information

- > Write a pitch on a page for up to \$10,000 outlining an idea to promote and support Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander business development in the ACT.
- > The Idea must consist of ideas not currently being provided within the ACT.
- > You may apply more than once but will need to provide a pitch for each idea on a separate page.
- > Priority consideration will be given to proposals that support the following sectors: tourism, visitor economy, construction, export and trade.

Eligibililty

- > Be an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander business or organisation based in ACT—at least 50% Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander owned and be able to provide evidence if requested.
- > Present an innovative idea or format that is not currently delivered within the ACT.



Pitch on a page

Outline your idea



- > Using a one-page document outline your idea to promote and support Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Business Development in the ACT with a budget breakdown included.
- > Include any other Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander businesses that would be engaged within your project.

Payment of funds



- > Please note funds are able to be paid into a Business, Organisation or Corporation account only.
- > Funds are not able to be transferred into an account in the name of an individual. (50% payment of funds will occur within 7 days of receipt of the signed agreement with bank details. The final 50% of funds will be processed within 7 days of Coolamon Advisors receiving promotional material for the event).

Notify of success



> When successful don't forget to let Coolamon know the details of your project and send any promotional material to **amanda@coolamonadvisors.com.au** so we can assist with letting the community know about the opportunity.

How to acquit

Funds must be expended in full with no carry over.


